INCLUDED IN PRICE: 1) Round trip airfare per brochure, deluxe motor coaches, First Class / Superior First Class hotels, guided sightseeing, entrance fees to sites visited, breakfast daily, dinner per brochure; 2) Taxes and fuel charges totaling \$714.70 USD comprised of \$384.30 for fuel charges (subject to increase by airline up to 30 days prior to departure) and \$330.40 for taxes (including federal inspection fees for the U.S. Customs and Immigrations; international air transportation tax; agricultural tax; other per person taxes imposed by government entities; airport taxes and fees including the September 11th Security fee up to \$10 per person, passenger facility charges up to \$18 per person, federal domestic flight segment fees up to \$3.50 per segment and U.S. and International arrival and departure, and other government imposed fees up to \$300 per person); 3) Gratuities of \$180 for tour guide or cruise director, local host, driver, local guides, and/or ships' crew; gratuities on ferries, and cruise ships. PAYMENT: A full deposit of \$500 per person is required at time of registration. Final payment must be made in the form of a check (credit cards are only accepted for initial deposit, any remaining payments must be in check form), and is due no later than 90-

Registrations received after 90-days prior to departure must be accompanied by full payment. ACCOMMODATIONS: Price is based on double occupancy (two persons sharing a room). When available, single rooms are often smaller than doubles. While *imagine* will try to match roommates, we cannot guarantee one will be available. Roommates may be assigned as late as 35 days prior to departure. If one is not available or if you request a single room, there will be a single room supplement charge: \$575 for basic itinerary. ITINERARY and CHANGES: Because airlines often change flight schedules after

brochures are printed, *imagine* reserves the right to shorten or lengthen the itinerary accordingly. You will be notified in writing when possible. If itinerary changes necessitate extra overnights, you will be charged \$195 per night/per person (single rooms \$225/ night). Meals for extra nights are not included. Any changes and/or deviations from the program and/or departure city listed by the passenger must be provided in writing to *imagine* no later than 75-days prior to departure and any extra costs incurred will be

to **imagine** no later than 75-days prior to departure and any extra costs incurred will be billed to the passenger. Passengers changing from the regular tour to Land Only after 120 days prior to departure will be charged a fee of \$150 per person.

AIRLINE TICKETS: In order to keep prices low, *imagine* does not guarantee you will be on the most direct flights to your final destination. *imagine* also does not guarantee the group will be on the same flights. Flight routings are chosen by the airlines and not *imagine*. Airline tickets cannot be changed or refunded once issued. Air transportation to/from your destination will be economy class aboard IATA and ARC carriers utilizing APEX or SUPER APEX non-refundable, non-amendable tickets for groups of 10 or more flying together for entire itinerary. *imagine* is unable to use individual frequent flyer points to upgrade or accept them as partial payment for air transportation. 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In The Footsteps of Martin Luther

12-Day Germany Reformation Tour

Hosted by: Pastor Robert Balza

Travel Dates: September 27 - October 8, 2017



DAY 1 - WEDNESDAY, SEPTEMBER 27: U.S.A., GERMANY

Tour members meet and board the international flight to Germany. Shortly after take-off, dinner will be served. We enjoy the in-flight entertainment program and breakfast before arrival.

DAY 2 – THURSDAY, SEPTEMBER 28: FRANKFURT, EISENACH

Upon arrival in Frankfurt, we are met by our tour escort who guides us to our waiting deluxe motor coach. Our driver and tour escort will remain with us for the entire tour. We begin our drive to Eisenach, by way of the famous Autobahn. There we check into Hotel Am Bachhaus, relax and enjoy dinner and overnight.



DAY 3 - FRIDAY, SEPTEMBER 29: EISENACH, WARTBURG **CASTLE, ERFURT**

After breakfast, we enjoy a guided walking tour of Eisenach, the birthplace of J.S. Bach and an important stepping stone on the path of Luther. We visit St. George's Cathedral where St. Elisabeth was married and J.S. Bach was baptized, as well as the Bach House, where we tour the museum and listen to a short concert on original old instruments. Then we visit the Luther House where Luther lived as a student with the Cotta family from 1498-1501, and the Luther exhibition documenting his life and theology. The next stop takes us to the magnificent Wartburg Castle for a tour of the Great Hall, the Elisabeth Hallway, and the Luther Room where Luther, disguised as a knight, translated the New Testament into German. Luther fled here following the Diet of Worms in April 1521, where he was condemned as a heretic by Emperor Charles V. We end the day by driving to Erfurt, where Luther studied from 1501 to 1505 at the local university. We have dinner and overnight at Hotel Mercure Altstadt.

DAY 4 - SATURDAY, SEPTEMBER 30: ERFURT

Today we tour Erfurt. The city tour this morning leads us through the cobblestoned streets to view the Fish Market, the Town Hall, Krämer Bridge, St. Mary's Cathedral, and the Luther Memorial. We also visit the historical section to learn about St. Severus and St. Mary's Cathedral. Then we visit the Augustinian Monastery with its famous dome and stained-glass window choir. After a being caught in a terrible storm and nearly being killed by lightning, Luther vowed to become a monk if his life was spared. A few weeks later, he entered the Augustinian Monastery on July 17, 1505 as a student and took his vows as a monk in 1507. Afterwards we have a free afternoon and evening to explore the

city on our own, shop or just relax in one of the local cafes. Dinner is on your own. Overnight is again in Erfurt.

DAY 5 - SUNDAY, OCTOBER 1: MANSFELD, EISLEBEN, HALLE, **LEIPZIG**

This morning we drive toward Leipzig. Our first stop is Mansfeld where Luther grew up and started school at the age of seven. His family's stone house still stands on Luther Street. We visit Luther's home and St. George Church and we pass the Luther Fountain and Luther's school. A short distance from Mansfeld is Eisleben. Here we see the house where Luther was born in 1483 and the Church of St. Peter and St. Paul where he was baptized. We also visit St. Andrew's Church where Luther preached his last four sermons and where his body was laid in state. Furthermore we see the house where he died in 1546 along with St. Anne's church. We continue to Halle, where we have a short stop to visit the Market Church and to see Luther's Death Mask, before continuing to Leipzig where we have dinner and overnight at Hotel Mercure am Johannisplatz.

DAY 6 - MONDAY, OCTOBER 2: LEIPZIG

This morning we tour Leipzig by bus and by foot including the landmarks of this important city. They represent the peaceful revolution of Germany in 1989. These include the Opera House, Gewandhaus Concert Hall, Moritzbastei, Naschmarkt and Goethe Memorial. Next, we visit St. Nicholas Church, one of Leipzig's oldest churches and starting point of the peaceful revolution that led to the reunification of East and West Germany. We will also include a visit to the St. Thomas Church, where J.S. Bach worked and now rests. Luther and Eck discussed Papal doctrine here in 1519. The afternoon is free time on our own. Dinner and overnight is in Leipzig.



DAY 7 - TUESDAY, OCTOBER 3: WITTENBERG, TORGAU, LEIPZIG

This morning we drive to Wittenberg for the day. Here we visit Luther Hall, the Augustinian monastery where Luther lived as a monk in his early years and later as owner with his wife and family. Luther Hall is the largest museum of Reformation history in the world. We tour the Market Square and Town Hall and explore All Saints' Church, where Luther posted his 95 Theses on the Castle Church door on October 31, 1517, sparking the Reformation. Luther is buried here alongside his fellow reformer, Philipp Melanchthon. We also visit St. Mary's Church where Luther did the majority of his preaching. Afterwards we drive to Torgau, the residence of the Electors of Saxony since 1456. We visit the area of Renaissance Hartenfels Castle and the Palace Chapel, the first protestant church in Germany (1540) which was built to the specifications of Luther and the Reformers. We also visit St. Mary's Church to see its famous Cranach Altar, the burial site of Luther's wife, Katharina von Bora. There was a plague in Wittenberg when she died, which is why she was not buried there next to her husband. We then walk through the city to see Katharina Luther's "Death House" and the Market Square with its wonderful Renaissance houses, the oldest toy shop, and the oldest pharmacy in Europe. In the evening, we drive back to Leipzig for dinner and overnight at our hotel.

DAY 8 - WEDNESDAY, OCTOBER 4: BAYREUTH, NUREMBERG, **ROMANTIC ROAD. AUGSBURG**

After an early breakfast, we drive south on the Autobahn to Bayreuth, the site of the annual Richard Wagner Festival. We have a photo opportunity at the festival house of Bayreuth and then continue to Nuremberg. Nuremberg is the center for the Lutheran Church in Bavaria. Before we have a short walk through the city, we have the possibility to try the famous Nuremberger Sausages for lunch (not included). Our walk gives us a view of Durer's House, St. Sebaldus Church and market square. In the afternoon, we follow a part of the "Romantic Road" with all its medieval villages to Augsburg. We enjoy dinner and overnight at Quality Hotel.

ETTAL

We begin the day touring Augsburg, one of Germany's oldest towns, founded 15 B.C. It was here in 1518 at St. Anne's Church that Luther met the papal legate, Cardinal Cajetan, who demanded that Luther submit to the pope. Augsburg was also the Tonight we enjoy an informal farewell dinner in a local restaurant site of another Imperial Diet (in 1530) at which Protestants presented their confession, which up to that time was the foremost doctrinal statement of the Lutheran church. We visit the site where the Augsburg Confession was signed in 1530. In the town hall, the Peace of Augsburg was signed in 1555, ending for a time the religious wars in Germany between the Catholics and the Protestants. After some leisure time here, we continue traveling the "Romantic Road" past quaint towns and villages before arriving in Ettal. Ettal Abbey is one of the largest Benedictine houses in Germany. It was founded on April 28, 1330 (Saint Vitalis of Milan's day) by Emperor Ludwig the Bavarian. The sacristy of the Abbey is a unique artistic jewel and famous as the most beautiful sacristy of South Germany. While our luggage is brought to our rooms of the Klosterhotel Ludwig der Bayer, we enjoy a guided tour of the basilica. Those who would like to can stay and listen to the chanted Vesper of the monks (30 minutes), before enjoying dinner at the hotel.



DAY 10 - FRIDAY, OCTOBER 6: NEUSCHWANSTEIN CASTLE, OBERAMMERGAU, MUNICH

After breakfast, we drive through picture book scenery of the Allgäu, on our way to one of King Ludwig's elaborate fantasy palaces and surely the crown jewel of Bavarian castles: Neuschwanstein. This castle was Walt Disney's inspiration for his Cinderella castle. After visiting this dreamlike place, we board our coach and continue our sightseeing as we visit the worldrenowned Oberammergau. This is the site of the extravagant Oberammergau Passion Play, performed only once every ten years. A short village tour and a view behind the Passion Play theatre gives us an impression of this quaint village and the upcoming Passion Play in 2020. In the evening we arrive in Munich. Dinner and overnight are at Maritim Hotel Munich.

DAY 11 - SATURDAY, OCTOBER 7: MUNICH

On our morning sightseeing tour, we learn about Nymphenburg Palace - the former summer residence of the Royal Bavarian family - the Church of our Lady, BMW World, the Hofbrauhaus and the sites of the 1972 summer Olympics. The tour consists of DAY 9 - THURSDAY, OCTOBER 5: AUGSBURG, ROMANTIC ROAD, famous buildings and squares including the Marienplatz with the town hall and its "Glockenspiel" and the "Frauenkirche" (Church of our Lady) with its distinctive onion topped towers. We have free time in the afternoon to stroll through the Marienplatz with its numerous shops or visit the fresh produce and flower markets. before our final overnight in Munich.

DAY 12 - SUNDAY, OCTOBER 8: MUNICH, U.S.A.

Today it is time to say "Auf Wiedersehen" when we transfer to the airport for our return flight to the U.S.A. We arrive back in the U.S.A. the same day.
